NC ABC COMMISSION ISSUES SUMMARY SUSPENSION OF ALCOHOL PERMITS AT CHARLOTTE CLUB 935

RALEIGH – Sworn statements from local law enforcement detailing an Aug. 7 shooting incident and a history of violence at a Charlotte location have resulted in a decision by the NC ABC Commission to suspend the alcohol permits held by Club 935. The business, located at 935 South Summit Avenue, Charlotte, has held ABC permits since 2009.

The NC ABC Commission’s suspension order was served today by officers of the Mecklenburg County ABC Board.

According to affidavits from Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department officers, the Aug. 7 shooting occurred outside the business and involved approximately 15 rounds fired into a crowd by a patron of the club.

The summary suspension is immediate and is in effect until the case is heard by the Office of Administrative Hearings. The action is authorized under N.C. General Statute 150B-3(c), which states: “The proceedings shall be promptly commenced and determined.”

This is the third summary suspension issued this year by the NC ABC Commission and is part of the Commission’s ongoing focus on public health and public safety. In September 2013, ABC Commission Chairman Jim Gardner sent a letter to more than 1,000 businesses in North Carolina that hold permits as private clubs to sell and serve alcohol. The letter provided a recap of the regulations related to private clubs and warned club owners and operators that the Commission may impose substantial fines and penalties for ignoring the law or for allowing violence at these locations.

ABOUT THE NC ABC COMMISSION

North Carolina is one of 17 states to regulate alcohol through a control system. Since 1937, the North Carolina Alcoholic Beverage Control Commission has provided regulation and control over the sale, purchase, transportation, manufacture, consumption and possession of alcoholic beverages in the state of North Carolina. The Commission oversees permits allowing alcohol sales by more than 18,000 retail outlets across the state. <http://abc.nc.gov>.
